New Community Consultative Committee for Hillside

A new Community Consultative Committee for the Rex Minerals' Hillside Mine Project had its inaugural meeting in early February. This follows a public call last year for applications to fill community positions on the Hillside Mine Community Consultative Committee (HMCCC).

Independent Chair, Mr Phil Tyler advised the previous community group, Hillside Mine Community Voice (HMCV) played an important community engagement role in the mine approval process. Once approvals were in place, the group instigated an independent review, to prepare for the next phase, and to meet the future needs of the community and the project.

"The new HMCCC will support the building of trust between Rex and the community, and will focus on interests of the entire community. The main areas of focus include social and community benefit, employment, business opportunities, community investment, influence of the project on community infrastructure and services, as well as high-level observation of key operational performance indicators that may impact the community."

Mr Tyler said "The HMCCC is an independent group that is all about community, our key approach is to work closely with Rex to ensure that the Yorke Peninsula community gets the best possible outcomes from the Hillside development. We are working with, not for Rex Minerals. Locals should be excited about this opportunity to bring a new level of employment and economic prosperity to Yorke Peninsula"

Rex Minerals Chief Operating Officer, Jason Schell said "Rex has a commitment to provide communities where we operate, with sustained benefits as a result of our activities. We look forward to working with the HMCCC to help maximise local benefits and create a lasting positive legacy that a project like this can bring to regional communities."
