
- Median age of 51 compared with 41 for State

Local priorities for the Yorke Peninsula

Economic diversification

- Agriculture accounts for
 - **30.5% of output (\$353 million)**
 - 27.0% of employment (1,064 people)
 - 26.3% of value added (\$141 million)
- Services sector accounts for 79% of value added and 88% of employment (PC, 2021)
- Agriculture's share of total employment has more than halved in last 25 years

Housing

- 2016 estimate of housing stock 9,742
 - 2022 modelled estimate 10,025
- Modelled occupancy rate (2022) 51.5%
- Dwelling approvals rate (p.a.) averaging 55 between 2017 – 2022
- Utilisation + pipeline = supply

Local priorities for the Yorke Peninsula

Infrastructure

- Adequacy of infrastructure to meet current and future demands
 - \circ Roads
 - Digital and telecommunications
 - GPs and specialist services
- Viability of existing services where demand profiles are changing
 - o Schools
 - EDs and certain medical services

Character

- Individuals and communities priorities, perspectives and ambitions
- Differences between:
 - Individuals and communities
 - Communities and townships
- Balancing different (sometimes competing) land uses
- Managing outcomes and changes over time

Spotlight on childcare

Service planning

- Average number of children (S.Y.O.A) = 94
- Catchment pool 0 3 year-olds
 - o 282 children in any given year
- Average hours of services utilised per week = 22.5
 - 169 places required

Benefits of adequate access to childcare

- Productivity lifetime earnings
- Development and wellbeing
- Mental health and wellbeing
 - \circ $\,$ Reduction in co-morbidities, health costs $\,$
- Participation, labour and household incomes
- Avoided costs of travel (VOC and VTT)
- Reduced cost of public services
